Sudden Infant Death Syndrome(SIDS) or "crib death" is defined as the sudden and unexpected death of an apparently healthy infant which remains unexplained after a complete case study and postmortem examination is completed.

SOME BASIC FACTS ABOUT SIDS	WHAT SIDS IS NOT
SIDS is a definite medical entity and is the major cause of death in infants during he first year of life.	SIDS is not caused by external suffocation.
Approximately 6,000 to 7,000 SIDS deaths occur annually in the United States.	SIDS is not caused by the type of feeding method used.
Statistically, SIDS deaths occur in 2 per 1,000 live births.	SIDS is not caused by immunizations
The peak incidence is between two and four months of age.	SIDS is not caused by child abuse or neglect.
SIDS occurs in all socio-economic levels.	SIDS is not caused by over-heating.
SIDS victims appear to be healthy prior to death.	SIDS is not caused by vomiting or choking.
At this time SIDS cannot be predicted or prevented, even by a physician.	SIDS is not contagious, it is not an infectious disease process.
There appears to be no suffering; death occurs very rapidly, usually during periods of sleep.	SIDS does not cause pain or suffering to the infant.
